Last Week's Program: Micah Brinkley

Brinkley wears icah many hats. He is the Co-Chairman of the Leadership Paragould Program, Past Chairman of The Community Fund Drive and is the Executive Director of the Children's Homes of Paragould. He was born in Paragould and graduated from Crowley's Ridge Academy and Crowley's Ridge College. His dad worked at Walden Drug and was a minister. Micah only actually lived in Paragould the last semester of his senior year in high school even though CRA is where he always attended school. He always knew Paragould was home. After his wife graduated from college in Tennessee, they knew they were coming home. Brinkley says that Paragould is great! Not because of the industry or business but because of the people. The people of Paragould help the Children's

Homes every day, whether they do it directly or not. Brinkley believes that it is the way that the people of Paragould treat people. The Children's Home of Paragould was formed with one cottage in 1955 because church members who were taking in children wanted a permanent place for them. The Children's Home of Paragould now has 9 cottages, a farm and an equine rehabilitation center and 78 kids. The Children's Home currently has 11 children from Liberia who grew up in refugee camps and fought battles with machine guns. The children could not believe they were going to receive a room of their own. "Even if you don't think you play a part in what is happening at the Children's Homes, you are. By the way you live your life, run your business and raise your children. Be really good at what you do, for your kids, for our kids, "Brinkley said.

The ABCs of Rotary: The Rotary Foundation's Beginning

Some magnificent projects grow from very small seeds. The Rotary Founda-tion had that sort of modest beginning. In 1917, RI President Arch Klumph told the delegates to the Atlanta conven-

tion that "it seems eminently proper that we should accept endowments for the purpose of doing good in the world." The response was polite and favorable, but the fund was slow to materialize. A year later, the Rotary Endowment Fund, as it was originally labeled, received its first contribution of US\$26.50 from the Rotary Club of Kansas City, Missouri, USA, which was the balance of the Kansas City convention account following the 1918 annual meeting. Additional small amounts were contributed each year, but after six years the endowment fund had reached only \$700.A decade later, The Rotary Foundation was formally established at the 1928 Minneapolis convention.

In the next four years, the Foundation fund grew to \$50,000. In 1937, a \$2 million goal was announced for The Rotary Foundation, but these plans were cut short and abandoned with the outbreak of World War II. In 1947, upon the death of Paul Harris, a new era opened for The Rotary Foundation as memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, The Rotary Foundation has been achieving its noble objective of furthering "understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations." By 1954, the Foundation received for the first time a half million dollars in contributions in a single year, and in 1965 a million dollars was received.

It is staggering to imagine that from those humble beginnings, The Rotary Foundation is now receiving more than \$65 million each year for educational and humanitarian work around the world.
